

Safety Operation Acknowledgement:

- (1) A responsible ADULT MUST SUPERVISE Inflatable at all times.
- (2) Do not allow children to enter the inflatable without 100% CONSTANT ADULT SUPERVISION.
- (3) All riders must remove shoes, jewelry, eyeglasses, combs, hair clips or any other sharp or hard objects that may cause injury to other children or the inflatable prior to entering ANY inflatable.
- (4) Absolutely NO Food, Drink, Gum, or Silly String inside Inflatable.
- (5) When riders are in the Bounce House/Inflatable, there should be NO flips, wrestling, running, pushing, climbing the net walls or any other aggressive behavior that could injure other children. Do not let riders bounce against the nets, sides or entrance.
- (6) Only children of comparable age and size should use inflatable at same time. Mixing children of different sizes will greatly increase the risk of injury.
- (7) It is best if children do not sit or lay down while other children are bouncing around them, as a jumping child could fall down on top of a sitting or lying child.
- (8) In case of rain, lightning, high winds, or if any other condition exists which may cause an unsafe or questionable condition STOP the children from bouncing and have them exit the bouncer. Once all children have exited turn the blower motor off wait for the weather to subside or for any other condition to change before allowing children to re enter the inflatable.
- (9) If the blower motor stops: Have the children calmly exit the inflatable. Most often the cause is an overloaded circuit or a piece of debris in front of the blower intake. Reset the circuit breaker and make sure the blower is plugged into a dedicated circuit. Clear any debris away from the intake on the blower.
- (10) If the bouncer gets wet, everyone should exit and the blower should be unplugged. A wet bouncer becomes very slippery and dangerous. Once the rain stops, you can dry the unit with towels and the bouncer will be safe to use. All sprinklers should be shut off.
- (11) Individuals with head, neck, back or other musculo-skeletal injuries or disabilities, pregnant women, small infants and others who may be susceptible to injury from falls, bumps or bouncing are not permitted in the unit at any time.
- (12) The moonwalk can be setup on grass, cement, concrete, asphalt, dirt, or any other surface that is relatively flat (except for sand). A slight slope is not a problem. We do NOT encourage setups near swimming pools.
- (13) You must have at least one foot of extra space around the perimeter of the moonwalk. The entrance side should face an open area and unit must be within 100 feet of an electrical outlet.
- (14) FAILURE TO USE GOOD JUDGMENT AND TO FOLLOW THESE SAFETY RULES CAN RESULT IN SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH. THE OPERATOR SHOULD ALWAYS INSURE THE UNIT IS PROPERLY SUPERVISED AND ALL SAFETY RULES ARE FOLLOWED.
